#### **Allergy Awareness**

More and more children in our care have life-threatening food allergies. For these children, smelling, eating or touching allergy-causing food can trigger a life-threatening allergic reaction (also known as anaphylaxis). If not treated, it could lead to collapse and death. Some anaphylactic reactions can occur within seconds or minutes of contact with the allergy-causing food. Other reactions may take an hour or longer to appear. The only way to prevent this type of reaction is to avoid contact with allergy causing foods.

Rutland Elementary has a school-wide awareness policy on peanuts and tree nuts. Parents are asked to carefully read product labels prior to sending any foods to school to ensure they do not contain peanuts and/or nuts within the ingredients list. Teachers may send home a letter outlining the specific nature of the allergy in your child's classroom. As well, please remind your children to not share their lunches.

As adorable and fun as dogs can be, unfortunately all dogs, even on leash, are prohibited from school property by the City of Kelowna bylaw. This also includes tying your dog to the fence and leaving the animal unattended. Owners that violate the bylaw may be fined \$100 by the Regional District of Kelowna. If you are walking to meet your child and you have a dog with you, please plan to meet your child off of school property. Thank you to those parents who have been waiting with the four legged family member just outside the property. We appreciate everyone's cooperation.

**September 30th** was marked as a statutory holiday - the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

We are excited to start a new year of looking after Mother Earth through some important initiatives we will be running this year. These include-

- <u>Battery Recycling</u> Challenge for the month of October, sponsored by Earth Rangers
  - A box will be in the school foyer for you to drop off used batteries. The more we recycle, the more we help our home planet plus Earth Club will have a chance to win a recycling contest.

Battery types to recycle are:

Single use batteries AA, AAA, 9V, C, D and button cell

Recyclable batteries: Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Nickle Zinc (Ni-Zn), Nickle Metal Hydride (Ni-MH)

- Soft Plastics Recycling Program will continue this year. Collection dates will be:
  - October 4, November 1, December 6, January 3, February 7, March 6, April 3, May 1, June 5 and June 26. All 'clean' soft plastics are welcome.
  - We will continue to collect soft plastics from each classroom throughout the year.
- Earth Club will also continue to
  - o care for our planters at the front entrance (sponsored by RLEPAC)
  - o observe and monitor the Milkweed we planted last year for Monarch Butterfly activity.
  - o maintain the bee and insect houses we installed 2 years ago.
  - take our lead from our Earth Club members and explore new ways to support our planet.
